Mainstreams received awards from two key funders.

Columbia Basin Trust, through the Regional District of East Kootenay Community Initiatives Grant awarded us \$8,973 for Mainstreams **Riparian Habitat Watershed Education Project**.

The riparian enhancement will take place in Kimberley's Mark Creek Flume Restoration project and at Spooner Park in Cranbrook.

BC Hydro Community Giving program awarded Mainstreams \$8,000 for our Mainstreams Goes Distance Education project.
