

Two years in the making, lots of meetings with Kimberley City, funding from the **RDEK Community Initiatives** fund, agreement by the City to provide hole digging services and a load of composted top soil - Mainstreams has been able to enhance the riparian vegetation at the small park just upstream of the Wallinger Bridge. Laura Duncan designed the project with approval from City staff. The planting took place on two Fridays in October. If you drop by, pay attention to the large number of plants on the rocky bank.
